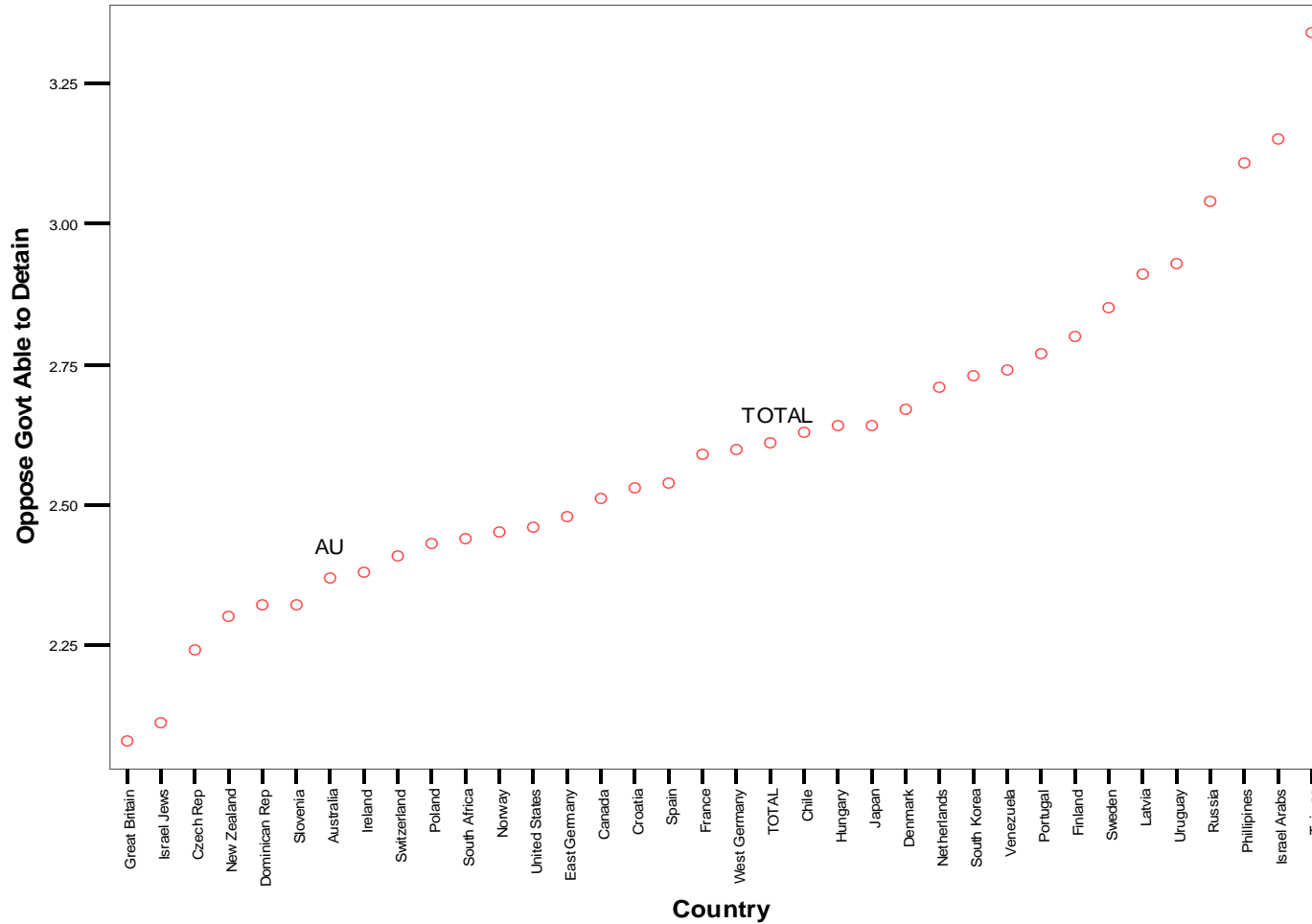


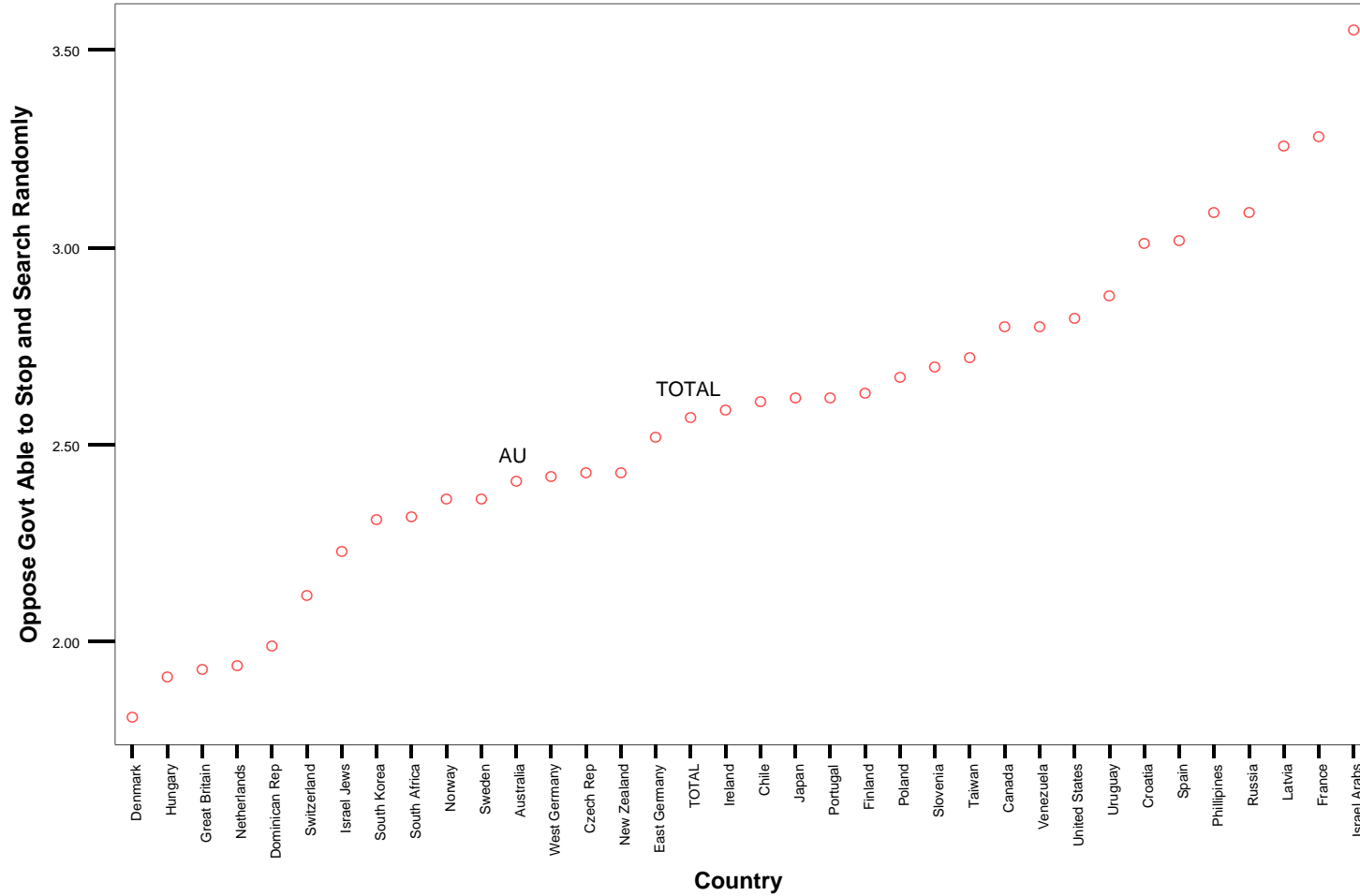

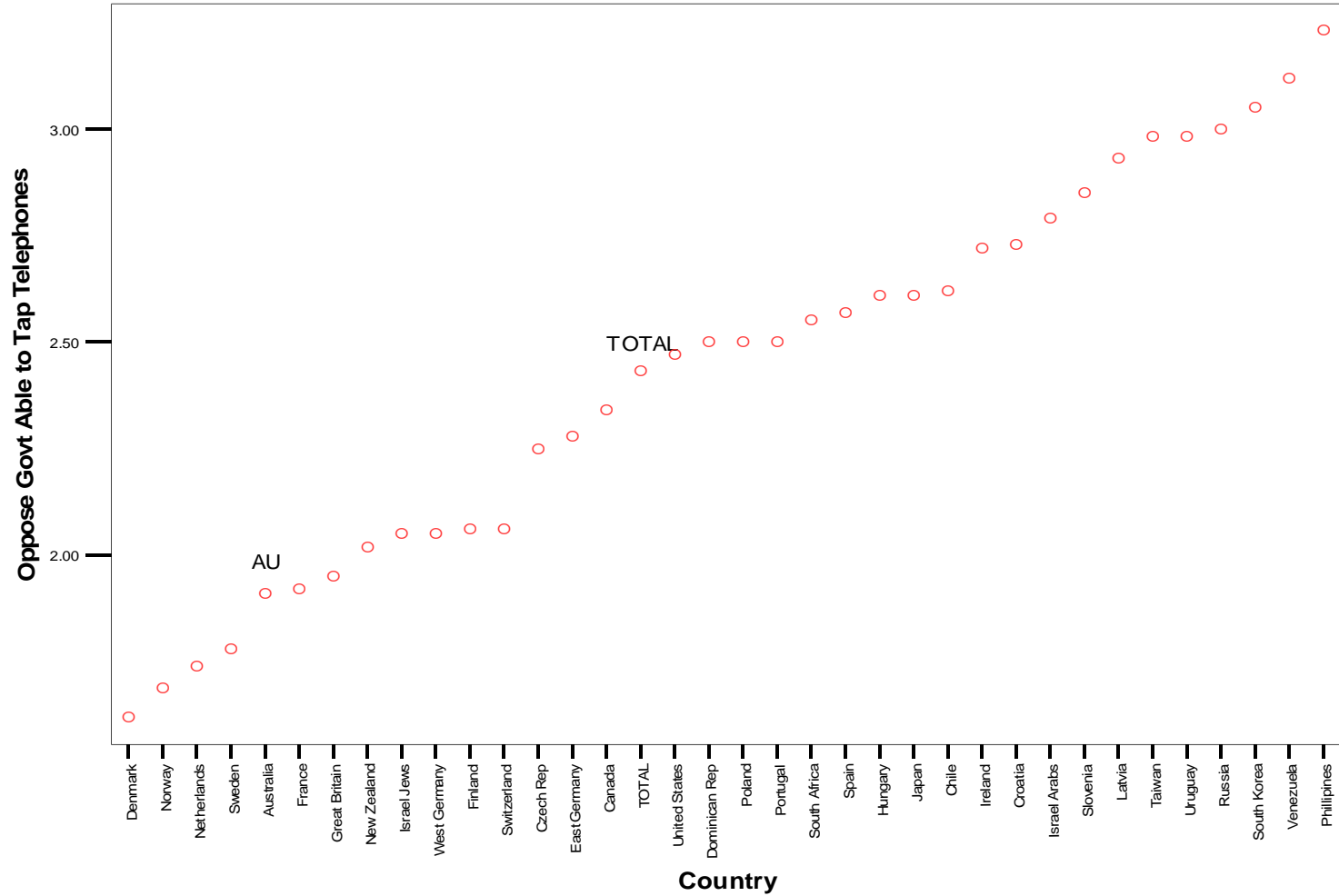

 by Country

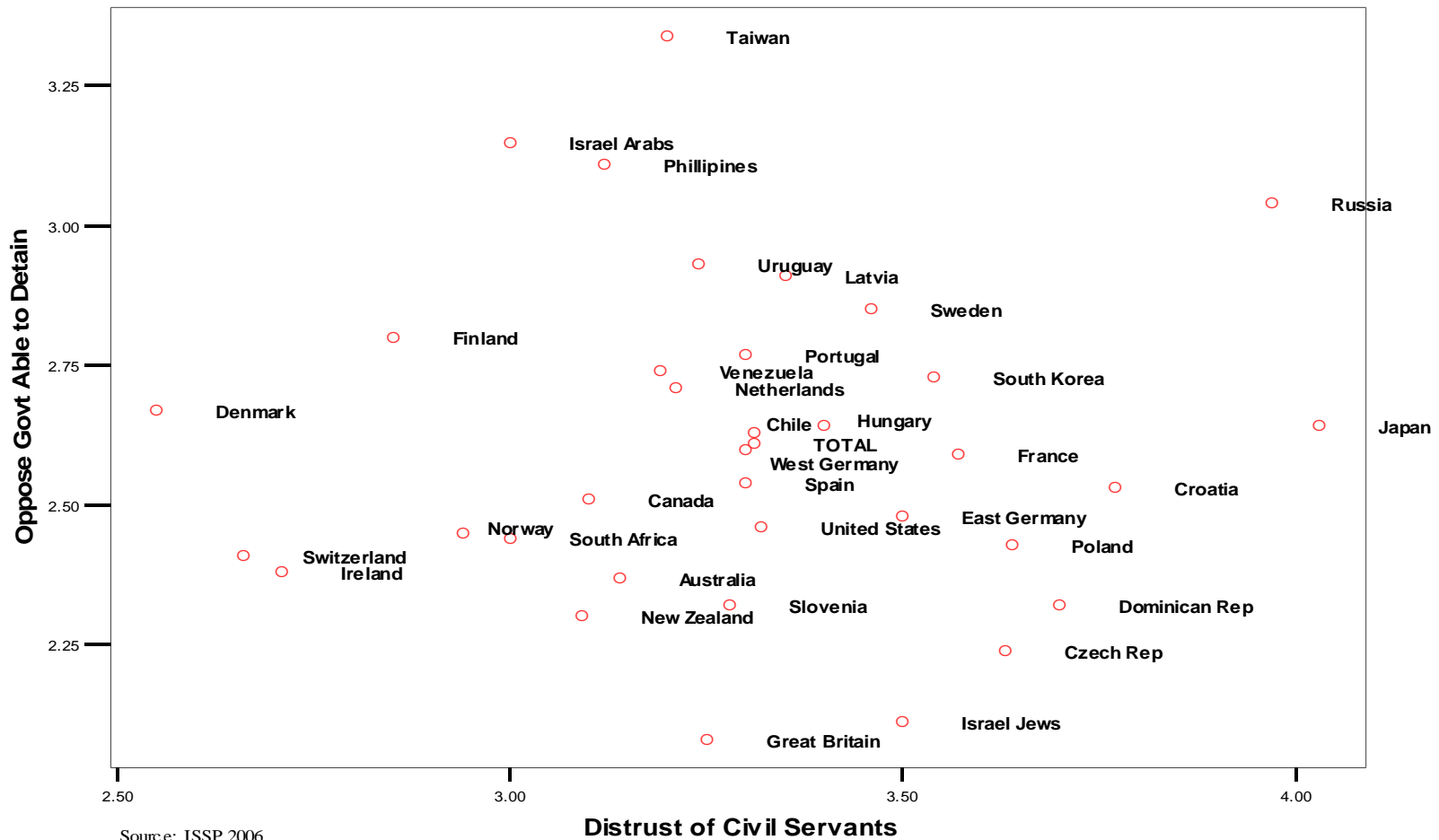
